

The Department of Languages and Cultures of William Paterson University seeks an adjunct instructor in modern Hebrew language to begin the fall 2016 semester (September 1<sup>st</sup>). Native fluency in Hebrew, near native fluency in English, and experience in teaching modern Hebrew as a second language (at the college level preferred). M.A. required (does not have to be in Hebrew Studies). Degrees must be from a university accredited by the US Department of Education or an internationally recognized accrediting organization.

Instruction in Hebrew is being reintroduced after several years' hiatus, as part of a new Middle East Studies Minor. The first year, the adjunct instructor will teach one section of Basic I Hebrew in the Fall semester, and one section of Basic II Hebrew in the Spring 2017 semester. The second year the instructor will teach Basic I and Intermediate I in the Fall, followed by Basic II and Intermediate II in the Spring. There is a possibility of developing literature or other content courses for the minor after the first year.

Position is renewable based on performance, programmatic needs and funding. Applicants must address [*sic*]

William Paterson University is a public university within the New Jersey system, with approximately 11,500 students. Applicants must address their ability to work with and instruct a culturally diverse population. The campus is 20 miles from New York City. Salary is comparable to adjunct salaries in other NJ public institutions.
