

## Archaeological Fieldwork Opportunity

The Archaeological Institute of America (AIA) through its Jane C. Waldbaum Archaeological Field School Scholarship can help for details go to [www.archaeological.org/grants/708](http://www.archaeological.org/grants/708) This scholarship is open to all students in any college or university.

Special Scholarship for New York City College/University Students In addition to eligibility for the general Waldbaum Scholarship program mentioned above the AIA-New York Society (NYS), the largest of the AIA's over 100 local societies, has a special fieldwork scholarship only for students matriculated at New York City colleges/universities.

Some pertinent details of the NY Society Scholarship are:

Purpose: To cover some costs of a student to participate in an archaeological fieldwork school

Amount: \$1,000

Eligibility:

- Must be matriculated at an accredited college or university within the five boroughs of New York City, but do not have to be residents of NY City;
- Open only to junior and senior undergraduates and first-year graduate students;
- Must not have previously participated in archaeological fieldwork of any kind;
- Must be for archaeological fieldwork but there are no restrictions geographically or by time/culture period for the proposed field work scholarship;
- Minimum stay of one month/4 weeks;
- Must be a current member of the AIA or must join the AIA at the student rate;
- Open to students from all backgrounds but students majoring in archaeology or related disciplines are especially encouraged to apply;
- Must be at least 18 years old
- The scholarship committee considers both academic achievement and financial need.

Timing: - Mid-December 2015 - Application forms become available;

- March 1st, 2016 Deadline for submission of all application materials;

- No later than April 20, 2016 Award notification date.

Application & Information: - The NYS Fieldwork Scholarship is administered by the AIA national office's Waldbaum Scholarship Committee

- The NY Society Fieldwork Scholarship follows the guidelines and requirements of Waldbaum Scholarship except that eligibility is only for students matriculated at NY City accredited colleges and universities.

- Application is made on-line through the AIA national office in Boston
