

The Department of Classical and Ancient Near Eastern Studies at the University of Wisconsin-Madison invites applications for a full-time, tenure-track position in Northwest Semitic Languages and Hebrew Bible at the rank of Assistant Professor, to begin August 2016. Applicants should hold a doctorate, or anticipate its completion by the start of the appointment, with specialization in Hebrew Bible or related discipline. Applicants should have established a promising research trajectory and demonstrated excellence in teaching. Teaching responsibilities are two courses per semester and include large enrollment undergraduate courses in literature and culture of the Ancient Mediterranean and Near East, intermediate courses in Hebrew language, and advanced courses and graduate seminars in Hebrew and Northwest Semitic languages and literatures. Responsibilities also include the supervision and advising of MA and PhD students in the graduate program in Hebrew Bible as well as professional service.

Candidates should submit a cover letter that describes their research and teaching, three letters of recommendation, and a current curriculum vitae. Additional materials, including writing sample, may be requested at a later stage.
