The Yale Divinity School invites applications for a tenure-track faculty appointment as assistant professor or associate professor without tenure in the field of Hebrew Bible, to begin July 1, 2018.

Candidates must hold a Ph.D. or equivalent degree with specialization in Hebrew Bible or a directly related field, and must demonstrate a strong command of the languages of the Hebrew Bible and the scholarship thereon. Preference will be given to candidates who can effectively engage with post-historical-critical approaches, such as but not limited to, feminist, post-colonial, and literary interpretation.

The successful candidate will teach graduate lectures and seminars, advise graduate students, serve on School and University committees, and actively participate in the School's vibrant co-curricular programming. In an ecumenical environment, Yale Divinity School prepares students for ordained ministry in diverse Christian churches and for a wide range of professional involvements, including higher education, law, medicine, the arts, management, and public service.
