The exhibition will open in a new building in Dhahran, Saudi Arabia in Q3 2016. The consultant's primary role is Project Manager and Curatorial Coordinator, including some English interpretive content authorship where a pre-existing exhibition of approximately 360 objects will be augmented with 150+ never-before-exhibited objects for local and international audiences. This project is a partnership with the Saudi Commission for Tourism and National Heritage (SCTNH), the lending organization and authorizing agency.
