

Brite Divinity School at Texas Christian University is accepting applications for the PhD program in Biblical Interpretation (BIIN) beginning in the fall of 2018.

Brite Divinity School's doctoral program in Biblical Interpretation combines opportunities for students to develop capacities for innovative scholarship through a focus on either Hebrew Bible or New Testament alongside preparation in research methodologies in both Testaments. Mentored by leading scholars Warren Carter (NT), Ariel Feldman (Jewish Studies), Wil Gafney (HB), Francisco Lozada (NT), Shelly Matthews (NT), and Timothy Sandoval (HB), students engage a variety of critical approaches to the Bible and other literature in the biblical tradition within the context of a theologically progressive institution committed to justice and diversity in its many forms.

All admitted students receive full tuition and an annual stipend for the first four years of study. Admission materials are due January 15, 2018.
