

Hebrew Language Teaching Fellow - Franklin & Marshall College

The Hebrew Program at Franklin and Marshall College invites applications for a one-year position as a Hebrew Language Teaching Fellow starting Fall 2016. This is a 60% of full-time position, with benefits. The position is renewable on evidence of excellence in teaching and/or continued administrative approval.

Responsibilities will include teaching two Hebrew language courses per year, conducting drill sessions, and assisting in the development and coordination of campus events related to the program. Applicants should have an MA in Hebrew or a related field, experience in teaching Hebrew, native or native-like proficiency in Hebrew and a high level of proficiency in English. Applicants should be able to instruct all levels of Hebrew, to develop new course materials, and to contribute to program building.

Applicants should include a cover letter, curriculum vitae, graduate transcript, three letters of recommendation, teaching evaluations, and teaching statement. All materials should be written in English. Interested candidates should apply at Interfolio <http://apply.interfolio.com/33463>.
