

YALE UNIVERSITY, Department of Near Eastern Languages and Civilizations, invites applications for a full-time Lector position in Modern Hebrew language. The initial appointment, beginning July 1, 2016, is for one to three years, depending on qualifications and experience, with a possibility of renewal. The successful candidate will be expected to work closely with the Program in Judaic Studies.

Applicants must have an MA or PhD in a relevant field in hand at the time of appointment. A native or near-native command of Hebrew and English is required, as well as a strong record of excellence in teaching Modern Hebrew language and culture at a university level.

The successful candidate will have a specialization in second language acquisition, pedagogy, or applied linguistics. The candidate should be familiar with the communicative approach to foreign language teaching and comfortable using technology in the classroom and incorporating technological innovations into the curriculum. An ACTFL (OPI) certification is preferable.

Responsibilities include teaching five courses per year of Elementary, Intermediate and Advanced content-based courses in Modern Hebrew language, and other duties associated with the Hebrew program. Among them: curriculum development, language placement exams, student advising, and coordination of campus events related to the program.
