### **Job Purpose**

To undertake high-quality research and research supervision, to make an active and high level contribution to the School of Humanities in the College of Arts and to teaching at undergraduate and postgraduate level in Archaeology.

The post-holder will be an expert in archaeological landscape research specialising in one or more of the following areas: archaeological remote sensing, Geographical Information Systems, landscape-scale 3D modelling, and visualisation.

The post-holder will bring period and regional expertise to complement current strengths, preferably in the Near East, the Mediterranean and/or Northwest Europe, and will develop an active programme of landscape-based archaeological fieldwork. The post-holder will undertake administration as requested by the Head of Subject and Head of School.

Salary will be on the University's Research and Teaching Grade, level 7, £33,943 - £38,183, level 8 £41,709 - £48,327 per annum.
