

Wolfson College is offering a fully-funded Scholarship for a student undertaking a graduate programme in Oriental Studies, specialising in Sumerian and Akkadian. Should there be a candidate of sufficient merit, the Scholarship will be held at the University of Oxford from the beginning of the academic year 2017-18, and will be co-funded by the Clarendon Fund.

Applications are invited from suitably qualified graduates who are applying for entry to DPhil or Master's programmes in Oriental Studies in October 2017. The Scholarship is awarded on the basis of academic merit and potential. It is open to applicants from all countries and will cover their full costs for the relevant period of fee liability, including the University composition fee, the College fee, and maintenance costs at the current UK Research Council rate. The successful scholar will become a member of Wolfson College.

There is no separate application process. Applicants, whether internal or external, should apply to the University of Oxford under the standard procedures for graduate degrees for 2017-18, by the relevant January deadline.

The Jeremy Allen Black Trust Fund was established in memory of Dr Jeremy Allen Black, a former Fellow of Wolfson College and University Lecturer in Akkadian.

Clarendon Scholarships are awarded by the University of Oxford to academically excellent students with the best proven and future potential. The scholarships are open to students starting a new course at Oxford and are highly competitive, with less than 3% of graduate offer holders being also offered the scholarship.
