The candidate should be a lively person who works well with others, who is comfortable in a highly diverse environment and who loves— and wants to transmit a love of— the Hebrew language and Hebrew language culture.

There are Language Fellows in each of the languages at Vassar and they form a friendly and cohesive community on campus. They work approximately 12 hours/week for a stipend of \$500 per month. They are expected to live on campus where they receive room and board, health insurance and can also take up to two classes per semester at the College. The College also covers their transportation to and from Vassar from wherever they are based at the beginning and the end of the academic year.

Each of our previous Language Fellows has been tasked by the instructor then teaching Hebrew to do slightly different things. Some have them have taught a section of language drill; some have them have lead a conversation hour; some have helped organize departmental/ program events and social activities; some have supported Hebrew courses through guest teaching (for instance, teaching a small unit during the regularly scheduled class, under the supervision and with the mentoring of the regular instructor), or help out with tutoring.

In all cases, however, the language fellow is closely supervised and mentored by the language instructor. It can be a really nice collaboration, and really helpful for both students and the instructor.
