Heidelberg University invites applications for a new (W3)-Full-Professorship „Cultural Heritage and Protection of Cultural Property “ at the Heidelberg Center for Cultural Heritage (HCCH), available at the earliest possible date. It is the aim to newly establish the discipline of „Cultural Heritage and Protection of Cultural Property“, with a full coverage of these fields in research and teaching. In cooperation with scholars and researchers from affiliated institutions at Heidelberg university, he or she will further develop the HCCH to become an inter- and transdisciplinary, internationally visible, and regionally cross-linked center for the study of material and immaterial cultural heritage and its transfer. Heidelberg University seeks a personality who has an excellent scholarly qualification in combination with an outstanding talent for organization and communication and who has experience in academic leadership and procuring third-party funding.

You will be expected to have a profound approach to all aspects of cultural heritage and to be familiar with legal, political, and practical questions of the protection of cultural property. The chair is responsible for directing and further developing the MA “Cultural Heritage and the Protection of Cultural Property”. The chair will also be in charge of the integration of the University’s collections in research and teaching, and is willing to participate in research networks and research projects. The international dimensions of cultural heritage and the protection of cultural property shall be built up and extended as well as the regional networks of the HCCH. It is expected that the successful candidate will further the communicative exchange with the public sphere about the significance of cultural heritage.

Prerequisites for a successful application are a university degree, a Ph.D. qualification, and (in accordance with Article 47, paragraph 2 of the Higher Education Law of the state of Baden-Wuerttemberg) a "Habilitation" or an equivalent qualification, preferably in a humanities subject, as well as an outstanding internationally visible research profile in the field of cultural heritage, and leadership in teaching and education.

The University of Heidelberg intends to increase the number of women in areas where they have been previously underrepresented. Applications from qualified women are strongly encouraged. Preference will be given to disabled applicants with equal qualifications and aptitude for the position.

Applications will consist of a CV, including a list of publications, a list of courses taught, and a statement of research interests and objectives – collated in one PDF file. Additional documentation, including copies of publications, will be requested from selected candidates, and should not be sent with the application.
